HISTORY RECORDER

Just over 500 years ago, in 1517, John Spurdance of Crowfield died and his will was proved. He left 20 shillings (£500 today) each to four of his sons and the same amount to Coddenham church where he wished to be buried. As a devout Catholic he also left money for a priest to pray for his soul and 20 pence (old money, so roughly £40) to the high altar at Coddenham for the tithes and offerings he had forgotten as well as the equivalent of £80 for repairs at Crowfield chapel. This was not to be the last reference to the need of repair at Crowfield. Subordinate to Coddenham it was not high on the agenda of anyone. Five years before his death Spurdance and others had attempted to have the vicar of Coddenham ordered to celebrate mass there, and failed. Four years after Spurdance died Henry VIII was accorded the title 'Defender of the Faith' by the Pope. Yet in the next decade he renounced allegiance to Rome and had himself declared head of the church in England.

Thomas Spurdance, John's fourth son, seems to have been an enthusiastic convert to the Church of England. So much so that he became a martyr during the reign of Mary Tudor. It is possible that his stubborn resistance to the reintroduction of Roman Catholicism had something to do with his father's dispute, forty years earlier, with the vicar of Coddenham.

John Spurdance had left his mother's house at Baylham to his eldest son, also John, once she had left it. His other sons and daughter would have their inheritance from the of his house at Crowfield, after his wife's death. Interestingly, William Dowsing, notorious for ordering removal of many 'superstitious' (Roman Catholic) images from churches, was also to live at Baylham in the seventeenth century.

I am grateful to Russ Spurdans, a descendant, for this information, which can be found in the Iveagh/Phillipps manuscript collection held at Ipswich Record Office.
