HISTORY RECORDER

January is the time when local history recorders prepare their reports on events and changes in their communities. These are eventually held at the Record Office, which itself is preparing for a change of name to The Hold and to change the appearance of the car park and environment of the University in Ipswich.

Most of the changes in Coddendam are almost invisible, involving works to the rear of houses or changes to cottages that are themselves invisible at the rear of others. Internal alterations are similarly invisible except to visitors.



The most noticeable change to the landscape has been the grain store on the Old Hall farmland. Approaching the village from Needham Road the sight of it is unavoidable. Equally unavoidable is the sight of the Duke's Head from the High Street. Permission has been granted for

renovations, but since the decision in April there has been no sign of work. One explanation is that renovation was contingent on planning permission being granted for new builds on the site. These were refused.

A smaller introduction has been the 'SID' that indicates the speed of passing vehicles and awards them a smile or a scowl as appropriate. The Parish Council was due to receive the first annual report of its reading in January. We can expect results in the next Parish Council Newsletter.

More positively, there was another successful Village Fete, some film and race evenings at the Community Centre, and carol singing in mid-December raised over £350 for the St Elizabeth Hospice. Thank you for a year of excellent support.
